Suzanne Michel is Chief Counsel for Intellectual Property at the Federal Trade Commission, where she handles the IP and IP/antitrust issues that arise in the FTC's enforcement and policy initiatives. The FTC awarded her the Paul Rand Dixon award for that work. Before joining the FTC seven years ago, Suzanne worked at the Department of Justice, where she defended the United States in patent infringement litigation.

Suzanne received her B.S. with honors from Northwestern University and her Ph.D. in Chemistry from Yale University. She graduated from Boalt Hall School of Law, where she was a member of the Order of the Coif and was awarded the prize for best paper published by a graduating student.
